From the wider church Uniting for the Voice

From the Presbytery Social Justice Group

The Uniting Church President Rev Sharon Hollis and Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress Interim National Chair Rev Mark Kickett have together affirmed their strong support for a Voice to Parliament. In welcoming last week the launch of the campaign to vote Yes in the Referendum, they described the acceptance and establishment of the Voice as a critical step toward honouring the sovereignty of First Nations Australians in this land and furthering the work of truth-telling and treaty. They supported a Yes vote for the Voice because they saw it;

".. as a pivotal step toward the full implementation of the Uluru Statement, so that as a nation we can finally confront the truth of our past and present and make way for justice."

Reverends Hollis and Kickett encouraged Uniting Church people and communities to inform themselves about the Uluru Statement and what it asks of our nation, and to create respectful spaces for yarning about the impact a First Nations Voice will make.

In the months leading up to the referendum we will provide more material on the Voice and the key issues surrounding the referendum question in the Presbytery weekly notices and other communications.

Nathan Tyson, Director, First Peoples Strategy and Engagement, NSW-ACT Synod, will attend the 25 March meeting of Canberra Region Presybtery at North Belconnen Uniting Church to discuss the Indigenous Voice to Parliament. We will webcast his talk on Zoom, from 11:15am to 12:30; a link will be forthcoming closer to the date. All are welcome to attend in person or online.



Across the UCA right now, there is a whole-of-Church project called Act2 that is working to discern God's call for the future of the Uniting Church. It's the most important process we've undertaken in 45 years and could be transformative for our life. Through Act2, we're seeking to address our challenges and forge a faithful, sustainable future. Every person who calls the Uniting Church home is invited to join their voice with the Project, offering insights to shape our directions and recommendations, and joining together in prayer.

This week The Act2 Project team have begun communicating with congregations, faith communities across the Uniting Church sharing with them information about the Act2 Project and inviting their Church Council or local leaders to have a conversation. They may not have reached every congregation and faith community, so the information is provided here to help ensure it is distributed as widely as possible.

The project team is also asking your Church Council or local leaders to have a conversation about the Act2 Project and the role it can play in helping local communities of faith flourish into the future. There is a Church Council Pack with six questions for you to discuss and share back.


