Have you ever wondered about......

The Mural at the front of the Church.....

When the worship space was being built 30 years ago, the New Church Committee were looking for ideas of what could go on the wall at the front of the church. Merran Toone was looking out her kitchen window and saw all the hills surrounding Queanbeyan, with the Queanbeyan Uniting Church right in the middle of it. Merran made a plaster of Paris 3D mock-up of the hills and the sky, all done in pastel colours.

The committee liked the concept and Geoff McCubbin took a picture of Queanbeyan from the Kings Highway, which was then given to the builders.

The windows in the church are also shaped like hills and where they meet a beautiful, timeless mural was created, entirely out of tiles of Queanbeyan and the surrounding area. The hills are also mentioned in several Bible verses.

From the bottom of the mural up — the layer of brown tiles represents the land we all live on, the dark blue and black tiles are the industrial area and river, then there are the pink and terracotta colours of the buildings and homes of the people of Queanbeyan. Above that, there are the green hills surrounding us and then more hills to include the rest of the Queanbeyan region. The sky is made from blue tiles with rays of white tiles representing God's light, beaming upwards.

Front and centre there is a beautifully crafted wooden cross, a symbol of Jesus's life, death, resurrection, and ascension. A sign of Hope, Peace, Faith, and Love for us all.

Why we call it 'The C.A.S.T" area.....

The area at the back of the church is called 'The C.A.S.T' area.

This was a carry-over from when we met in the Old Church and had morning tea in the room with the big mural on the ceiling, (which was painted by the youth groups when Reverend's Bill and Iva Fisher were here).

Every Sunday morning, we would gather for morning tea and then one of our parishioners would share their life story with the congregation. That is where the name C.A.S.T came from as it stands for Caring and Sharing Time. People discovered things they had in common and got to know each other much better. We also had a world map with pins in it showing where people came from.

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The Shed – Morning Tea held in conjunction with the Jumble Sale....

The Shed was named The Shed not just because it was originally held up the back at the Jumble Sale Shed. The Shed is named The Shed because people can come into our church and shed their inhibitions, they can shed a tear of joy or sadness, or perhaps shed light on something.

The word shed can also mean shelter, which is also a place where people feel safe and secure and are protected from the outside.

And all of this takes place where we remember Jesus Christ, who shed His blood for us.

Unfortunately, we had a disappointing response from the congregation in response to nominations for these positions. Only four members of the congregation made any nominations. Hopefully, next year we will all engage more with this process. One consequence of this poor response is that we currently have no Chairperson or Secretary of the Congregation. Church Council will consider how we deal with this problem going forward but if there is anyone in the congregation who feels they may be able to help by filling either of these roles, I urge you to speak with Apelu or someone on Council.

Saturday 23 March saw another very successful Jumble Sale, Shed and 'Let's Meet our Neighbour' barbeque. Aside for the very positive financial results, it is always great to see so many in the community gathering at QUC and having a happy time. Grateful thanks to the many people involved in running these activities.

Finally, we now have four new large mirrors installed in the hall – at no cost to QUC! Two of the groups who regularly hire the hall, the Queanbeyan Players and the Empire Dance Group joined forces to install the mirrors along the western wall of the hall and have generously met the full cost. The mirrors are useful for the activities of both groups and enhance the look of the hall. Those with long memories will recall there were mirrors in the hall many years ago, so it is nice to see the hall being restored to something of its 'former glory'! Thanks to our property manager, Glen Crawley, for coordinating this exercise.
