

From the Worship Committee

In 2022 the Worship Committee re-introduced the former practice of sending birthday cards to children baptised in our church, for the first five years of their lives.

From the Chair of Church Council

Council discussed a number of issues at its March meeting, including arrangements for the Holy Week services, a number of requests from the Worship Committee and notification from the Queanbeyan Palerang Regional Council (QPRC) of a development application it has received for land in Rutledge Street opposite the church.

Council agreed to provide funding for a 6.00 pm meal prior to the 7.00 pm Tenebrae service on Maundy Thursday (6 April). To assist with catering, congregation members planning to attend the meal should advise Sue Camm by Sunday 2 April.

Council agreed to a request from the Worship Committee that a candle table be reintroduced at QUC, providing members of the congregation with an opportunity to light a candle during the worship service should they wish to so. Council also considered a request from the Worship Committee to reintroduce a prayer book at QUC in which people could record requests for prayer. Council noted that, in view of privacy considerations, people could only ask for prayers for themselves, not for others, and agreed that any congregation member wanting prayers for themselves should pass this request to our minister, Apelu. Apelu would then convey this request to the person preparing the Prayers of the People for that week.

QPRC has provided the church, as a neighbouring landowner, with the opportunity to comment on a major commercial and residential development

proposed for Rutledge St on the land adjacent to the new QPRC offices. Council intends to respond to QPRC noting the need for it to consider carefully the implications of the proposed development for parking, shading of adjoining landowners and the heritage nature of the area.

We saw another very successful Jumble Sale and Shed on 25 March, despite unhelpful weather. The Meet our Neighbour sausage sizzle was held in conjunction with the Jumble Sale and was warmly welcomed by those who attended. Thanks to everyone who contributed to the Jumble Sale, Shed hospitality and the sausage sizzle; it is great that QUC can interact with our local community in these ways.

Two sad pieces of news. Long term member of QUC and good friend to many of us, Yvonne Wallace, passed away on 19 March after a long illness. Yvonne was a very active member of the congregation over many years being involved in a wide range of activities, including, especially, the Adult Fellowship and Samaritan's Purse – Operation Christmas Child.

Those of you who have been attending QUC for many years will also be saddened to hear of the sudden death of the Brett Furner from a heart attack on 5 March. Brett served as a supply minister at QUC for approximately six months in 2006, after the departure of the Rev Simon Hansford, and was greatly valued by many congregation members for his warmth, sense of humour and insightful preaching. Brett's "celebration of life" and memorial service will take place on Monday 17th April at Coolamon Uniting Church at 2pm. All welcome. In lieu of flowers donations can be made to Beyond Blue. Afternoon tea will be served in the hall afterwards.

We are still looking for someone to fill the role of Congregational Secretary. If you think you could help QUC in this way please speak with Apelu, Martin Harris or myself.

Bennie's Basket' Food Pantry

Congregation members are invited to bring along a grocery item or two each week to be placed in a basket at the church. Once a month, on communion Sunday, these items will be blessed as part of our offering to the work of God in our community, before being passed on to St Benedict's.

Bennies has provided the following advice; UHT milk, CEREAL (only Weetbix, cornflakes & Rice bubbles), tinned tuna large or small, Spaghetti and Baked beans, 2 min noodles, Pasta; Spaghetti or Spiral, Baby food or formula. From the wider church Uniting for the Voice

From the Presbytery Social Justice Group

The Uniting Church President Rev Sharon Hollis and Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress Interim National Chair Rev Mark Kickett have together affirmed their strong support for a Voice to Parliament. In welcoming last week the launch of the campaign to vote Yes in the Referendum, they described the acceptance and establishment of the Voice as a critical step toward honouring the sovereignty of First Nations Australians in this land and furthering the work of truth-telling and treaty. They supported a Yes vote for the Voice because they saw it;


".. as a pivotal step toward the full implementation of the Uluru Statement, so that as a nation we can finally confront the truth of our past and present and make way for justice."

Reverends Hollis and Kickett encouraged Uniting Church people and communities to inform themselves about the Uluru Statement and what it asks of our nation, and to create respectful spaces for yarning about the impact a First Nations Voice will make.

In the months leading up to the referendum we will provide more material on the Voice and the key issues surrounding the referendum question in the Presbytery weekly notices and other communications.

Nathan Tyson, Director, First Peoples Strategy and Engagement, NSW-ACT Synod, will attend the 25 March meeting of Canberra Region Presybtery at North Belconnen Uniting Church to discuss the Indigenous Voice to Parliament. We will webcast his talk on Zoom, from 11:15am to 12:30; a link will be forthcoming closer to the date. All are welcome to attend in person or online.


