

From the Chair of Church Council

The main agenda item at the Church Council meeting on 10 July was a presentation to Council by Ian Gray on the church's IT arrangements, including the use of Google Drive, the new QUC website, the QUC Facebook page, QUC On-Line (the church data base and administration system) and the broadcasting of church services via Zoom. There is a wealth of information on the church website and QUC On-Line. Council is very grateful to Ian Gray for all the work he has put into establishing and maintaining these platforms and I encourage congregation members to explore them. Our on-line presence is an increasingly important outreach in the present age.

Given the importance of privacy considerations, Council noted the importance of all congregation members being aware that our weekly services are broadcast via Zoom. Zoom remains an important means of ensuring that those who aren't able to be physically present on a Sunday morning can still participate in worship. Council also agreed to record Apelu's sermons each week. At this stage, this will be the only portion of the service which will be recorded. Recording the sermon will allow it to be posted on our website, as part of our mission to the wider community, as well as ensuring we have a copy should someone who missed it wish to hear it.

Council also endorsed a proposal from the Worship Committee that consideration be given to an outdoor chapel/meditation area in the church grounds. It is envisaged this could involve the erection of a wooden cross (currently in storage) and a number of benches. This area could be used if we held outdoor services; it would also serve as a space where members of the public could simply sit and reflect. Council has asked the Worship Committee to develop this concept further in consultation with Glen Crawley, who has responsibility for property issues.

Finally, Council noted that the new church heating was installed and working very well. Council expressed its gratitude to Glen Crawley, Rob Wilson and Greg Toone for their efforts in achieving this outcome. A number of congregation members have very generously made contributions to the church bank account to help with the cost of the new heaters and Council is very grateful for this response. Luckily, it is not too late to contribute – the Treasurer is still accepting donations!! Any contribution should be identified as being for the Heating Fund.


Queanbeyan District Girl Guides Trivia Night
