From Church Council

Well, that's June done and dusted – where does the time go? Not that June was going to go unnoticed, with a very long run of very cold mornings! Hopefully, everyone is managing to keep warm!

As most of you know, Apelu had two weeks leave in June and the final Sunday was a fifth Sunday, which Uniting Church ministers have off. That meant we were without our minister for three weeks. But the encouraging news is that QUC covered all three Sundays from our own resources. Church Council is very grateful to those who led, and participated in, these services over these three weeks. We have a lot of people in our congregation with the capacity to lead and contribute to worship, which is great, and I encourage everyone who thinks they may be able to do something in this area to have a go next time the need arises.

At its June meeting, Council noted that there were a range of issues around the rental of QUC property and agreed that those congregation members most closely involved in this work should meet to discuss these issues. That meeting, held on 10 June, allowed us to clarify the roles and responsibilities of everyone involved, to start proceedings to renew rental agreements with our major renters, to commence a review of the rental rates and to discuss approaches to improving security and care of the property. Rental of our property is a major source of revenue for QUC but it also involves considerable work and on-going expense. Council is very grateful to Leigh Harkness and Peter Bollard for managing the rental business and to Glen Crawley and Ruth Adams for keeping on top of property maintenance. One very good piece of news to emerge in the past month is that Uniting is wanting to renew their agreement to lease our property for another two years.

Those of you who have been to church in the last few weeks will probably have noticed that things look a lot brighter! Glen and Ruth have arranged an overhaul of the lighting in the new church building, replacing lights with more energy efficient LED lighting where possible. As the original lighting was around 30 years old, and some of it was no longer working, this improvement was very much

needed. The lights in the CAST are have been refreshed, but remain neon, rather than LED, as the cost of the full LED replacement there was prohibitive at this stage.

Another very successful Jumble Sale and Shed were held on 28 June. The minus 5 degree morning made for a very chilly start but, once the sun came out, we thawed out a little. Holidays, sickness and other constraints meant we had fewer helpers than usual, and the cold weather seemed to keep some of our customers in bed rather than bargain hunting. Nonetheless, Jumble raised an amazing \$1435 and the Shed cheered everyone's spirits with hot drinks and yummy tucker. Thanks to everyone involved.

Finally, I am delighted to report that the Synod Vital Leadership Team have notified us that Nicole Alexander has successfully completed the Presiding at the Sacraments course. This means Nicole is able to lead us in communion on those occasions when a minister may not be available. Congratulations Nicole! If there are any other members of the congregation who think they might be interested in undertaking this training, please speak with Apelu or Nicole. It would clearly be helpful for us to have several members of the congregation qualified to assist in this way.
